# How Advent Fits into the Church Calendar

The Cycle of Light - Seasons of revelation: God makes Himself known to us in Jesus

**Advent** - Four Sundays before Christmas

Christmas - 12 Days beginning on the Feast of the Nativity of Our Lord

**Epiphany** - Jan 6, the Feast of the Epiphany, recalling Jesus' coming to the Gentiles in the visit of the Magi and ending on the Feast of the Transfiguration.

The Cycle of Life - Seasons of redemption: God rescues us from death through Jesus.

**Lent -** 40 days beginning with Ash Wednesday

Paschal Triduum - Passover or Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday

Easter - 49 days beginning on the Feast of the Resurrection of Our Lord

<u>The Cycles of Love</u> - The extended season to walk in Christ's light, to grow in Christ and embody Christ's love.

**Pentecost** - the Presence of Christ in the world through the Spirit

**Ordinary Time** - nonfestal part of the year

# What is Advent?

During the 22-28 days leading up to Christmas, we focus on three comings of Christ: his arrival in history as a baby, his return in glory at the end of time and his intermediate entrance into our own lives.

# What do we do in Advent?

### **Church Traditions**

Our goal in sharing these Advent ideas is for our hearts to draw nearer to God and experience the wonder of Christ's incarnation - for you personally and for your family together.

- Advent Wreaths From Medieval Times. Light one additional candle each Sunday and read the scriptures. (Pink is the 3rd Sunday)
- O Antiphon Prayers Since the 7th century, these seven responses, or antiphons, that are sung or recited to introduce the canticle of Mary (the Magnificat) at evening prayer from December 17 to December 23. These antiphons are based on Isaiah's prophecies and refer to the different ancient titles given to the Messiah.
- St. Nicholas Day Dec 6 St. Nicolas lived in the 300s in Turkey. He became a priest and a bishop and helped to write the Nicene Creed. He was imprisoned for his faith. He was a man of faith whose goodness and generosity for the poor grew out of his love for God. It enriches our understanding of Santa Claus by showing the real historical person who inspired the familiar legend and traditions. St. Nicholas' generous example of giving in secret to those in need. How can we celebrate him? Encourage children to identify a kindly "Nicholas deed" to do for someone else. Have children fill their shoes with pieces of carrot or bits of hay for his white horse or donkey and place them outside bedroom doors or on the fireplace. Fill the shoes with candy or a simple gift to appear on December 6th. StNicholasCenter.org
- St. Lucia's Day Dec 13 St. Lucia (or Lucy) was a young devout girl in Sicily who was an early Christian martyr killed by the Romans in 304 under Emperor Diocletian. This feast day of the church is especially celebrated in Scandinavian countries, ushering in light to the world on the darkest day of the year. Children dress in white and pastries are served.
