

Dear Church,

Scottish theologian John Swinton writes about belonging. To be included, you need to show up — but to belong, "you need to be missed." True belonging means you are noticed in your presence, and missed in your absence. That definition has stuck with me. Community. Being known. Spiritual friendships. These are vulnerable and risky ideas, but they are also core to what it means to be a church, a community of people who belong to one another. It's why we continue to hold the ideal of belonging, that "No One Stands Alone."

Forging this kind of belonging community requires time and commitment, both elements of sacrifice. We show up for one another, often when we're tired. We evaluate our calendar and remove even good commitments to prioritize life together. We risk sharing vulnerably our struggles and failures, so that we can be known more deeply and experience the mercy of God through the love of forgiveness.

This Community Life Field Guide offers guidance for moving more deeply into belonging to Christ Church this fall. I hope you take a risk in this season at Christ Church and experience the salvation Jesus describes, no longer as servants, but as a company of friends. (John 15:15).

SPIRITUAL FORMATION GROUPS


Spiritual Formation Groups are meeting for 10 weeks, mid-September through mid-November, to grow together in being renewed in Christ. The groups will engage with John Mark Comer's *Practicing the Way* course, which is a primer on spiritual formation. This course includes inspiring teaching on topics like apprenticeship to Jesus, healing from sin, bringing your pain to God, crafting a Rule of Life, life in community, and more. Each week's session includes questions to spur authentic group discussion and engagement with spiritual practices to help you integrate your learning into your daily life.

Groups will be meeting throughout the week in all parts of the Austin area. The groups are capped in size to allow for rich discussion.

Several groups will be meeting at Christ Church on Sunday evening and Wednesday evening with childcare provided for kids from 0 to 5th grade. For groups meeting in homes, Christ Church has established a fund to help parents pay for home childcare while parents attend a group.

YOUTH

At Christ Church, we deeply value the formation of our youth.

For middle schoolers, *Ignite* meets twice a month on Sunday mornings from 10:30-11:30am. High school youth, *Eikon*, meet weekly on Sunday evenings from 5-7pm.

LOCAL ENGAGEMENT PILOT GROUPS

This fall, several new Local Engagement Pilot Groups are being launched with the hope of giving witness to the transformative power of Jesus to "mend our world." The Scriptural call to give witness to the Kingdom is an invitation to joyful proximity for all followers of Jesus. These groups are designed to help us live into this invitation to love where we live. They will center service, community, and formation — focusing their efforts on the unhoused, the lonely, the vulnerable, and those with disabilities.

REBEKAH BAINES JOHNSON CENTER

RBJ is an independent living center for seniors located less than a mile from Christ Church. Currently, the facility has 250 apartments with 130 designated for low-income residents and people with disabilities, with an additional 250 apartments coming soon. Many of the residents feel isolated and lonely. These residents are the modern-day equivalents of the ancient category of "widow."

BAPTIST COMMUNITY CENTER MISSION

BCCM is a community of individuals and churches who help meet the physical and spiritual needs of those living in poverty in East Cesar Chavez. This ministry provides clothing, food, and life skills education. Crucially, BCCM serves children experiencing food insecurity. Through this partnership, we can help ensure that every child in our neighborhood does not go hungry over the weekend when school meals are not available.

MORE THAN WELCOME

MTW is a Christian non-profit that supports refugees and asylum seekers in the Austin area. This ministry helps immigrants transition to life in Austin by providing transportation, ESL classes, childcare, community, and housing opportunities. Austin is home to about 12,000 refugees and asylum seekers, who are fleeing persecution, torture and death in their home countries.
